

Rosetown Senior Citizens Program Inc.



Purpose of the Organization: To increase and provide service and support to all seniors in the community as well as to provide recreation programs that encompass a wide range of needs and interests.

Participants: Men and women over 50 years of age.

Programs and Services: Rosetown Seniors Club became active in 1976. Bylaws were passed that members had to abide by. The Board holds an annual meeting every April, as well as holding a monthly meeting to warrant the success of the non-profit organization. Seniors meet each Tuesday for Bingo and cards, with lunch being served. The last Tuesday of every month is a pot-luck supper and each member is to bring some food. Pool and shuffleboard tables are available to play in the center's basement. There is a Seniors Choral Group who holds practices the Tuesday of every week, and entertains at the Nursing Wing and Centennial Lodge. Rosetown Seniors are members of Saskatchewan Seniors Association Inc. (SSAI). Seniors attend the annual convention in June of each year, as well as SSAI rallies in our area. A bowling tournament is held by SSAI annually, which our seniors participate in. The club is active in the Saskatchewan Seniors Fitness Association (SSFA).

Special Events: In February the Telemiracle Tea is held. Bus Tours are also held which travel to various points of interest in Saskatchewan. Seniors Fun Day is hosted by Rosetown Seniors each Fall.
