

# PROTECTIVE SERVICES & PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE

## MEETING – MARCH 11, 2024

1. Called to Order:  
Chairman Dolega-Cieszkowski called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
2. In-Camera: none
3. Conflict of Interest: None
4. Minutes:  
Protective Services and Public Works February 12, 2024 Minutes were reviewed by the Committee.
5. Financial Statement:  
The Committee reviewed the February 2024 Department Financial Statements.
6. Management Reports:  
**Public Works Report for February 2024** was discussed. Superintendent reported that the street sweeper is at a repair shop and they are hopeful it will be repaired and ready for spring. They are getting ready for spring drainage season.  
**Water Treatment Plant Reports for February 2024** this report was not available so will be taken to the March Council meeting for review.  
**Fire Department Report for February 2024** was reviewed by the Committee. Committee asked that Administration Staff do more posting on facebook and our website as well as send out flyers to promote the need for members.
7. Rosetown Transfer Station Tipping Fees (Bylaw No. 770-18):  
Committee discussed the rates charged at the Transfer Station. These rates were set in 2018 when the Town switched from a Landfill to a Transfer Station.  
  
Committee requested further investigation be done and brought to a future meeting for further discussion.
8. SarcAN Glass Recycling Contract Renewal:  
SARCAN Recycling sent in the contract renewal for the glass recycling as the current contract expires March 31, 2024. The rates will increase to \$0.1665 per pound for glass recycling and \$0.0320 per pound for freight.

**P-24-003 Recommendation:** That Council approve the Mayor and Chief Administrative Officer to sign a new contract for SARCAN Glass Recycling for April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025.

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9. National Police Federation Letter of Support:

The National Police Federation represents more than 20,000 RCMP members service across Canada and internationally includes over 1,375 members in Saskatchewan. The NPF has been advocating for a needed increase into Saskatchewan RCMP resources. The Province has announced that \$20 Million in annual operating costs will go to staffing 70 officers for the Saskatchewan Marshal Service in Prince Albert, however for that same amount, they could hire 100 RCMP officers distributed across the Province.

**P-24-004 Recommendation:** That Council write a letter of support to Honourable Scott Moe, Premier of Saskatchewan, to prioritize the Saskatchewan RCMP in the 2024 Budget.

10. 2024 Draft Budget:

The Draft Budget was circulated for discussion and a budget meeting with Council and Management will be set at a later date.

11. Adjournment: Councillor Carlson adjourned the meeting at 7:12 p.m.
