1. Called to Order:
Acting Chairman Carlson called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.
2. In-Camera: none
3. Conflict of Interest: Mayor Trevor Hay declared an interest in Item #9 Mountain View Crescent Alley Complaint – Delegation Tim Askin
4. Minutes:
Protective Services and Public Works September 9, 2024 Minutes were reviewed by the Committee.
5. Financial Statement:
The Committee reviewed the September 2024 Department Financial Statements.
6. Management Reports:
Public Works Report for September 2024 was discussed. Superintendent reported that he is having a difficult time finding a SABA tank as they are all on backorder. He is going to check with the Fire Department to see if they have any available.
Water Treatment Plant Reports for September 2024 were reviewed.
Fire Department Report for September 2024 was reviewed by the Committee. The Fire Department has responded to 78 calls since December 1, 2023.
Bylaw Officer's Report for September 2024 was reviewed by the Committee.
7. Boulevard Trees - 123 Jubilee Crescent
We are still waiting for a quote for the removal as well as a date the contractor will be in town.
8. Paving Pros/Cons List – Local Improvement vs Taxation:
Superintendent of Public Works presented some information regarding the paving program currently in place as well as what it could potentially look like if Council changed to a taxation levy for paving.

Committee asked that this be placed on our Facebook page and website for information to our public as well as kept as information for future Councils.
9. Mountain View Crescent Alley Complaint – Delegation Tim Askin
Mayor Hay declared an interest and left the meeting at 7:25 p.m.

Tim Askin met with the Committee from 7:25 p.m. to 7:58 p.m. to discuss the Mountain View Crescent alley. Tim's main concerns were the weeds in the back alley and why the Town could not go in and spray them or knock them down with the terabond and tractor.

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Superintendent and Committee explained there are a number of items, fences, trees, etc. in the alley stopping us from doing maintenance as well as putting our staff members at risk of damaging private property trying to do regular maintenance.

Superintendent suggested a letter be sent to each homeowner along this alley stating that we would be doing minimal maintenance to control the weeds in the alley. Any damages done to private property as a result would not be at the cost of the Town of Rosetown and we will not be held liable for any damages.
